More experienced outdoors people are also welcome to freshen up on skills or just hang out with people with similar interests. Must be in good physical condition.																
Environmental Hazards	'Risks include, but are not limited to: thermoregulatory risks, including hypothermia; injuries related to hiking and backcountry camping including soft-tissue injuries, dislocated joints, strains, sprains, fractures, concussions, burns, cuts, and potentially death. . With proper preparation and following of guidelines, however, most of these risks can be minimized. Clothing and outerwear must be adequate and will be subject to inspection.

February 5th

The trip will start at the OAC at TBA on Friday afternoon. Leaders will pick up vehicles and help get group gear packed. Then add participants' gear as arrive. Once we get going, we will stop in Grayling along the way for a quick meal (participants will be responsible for this cost). We will stop again after the bridge for gas and if anyone wants snacks. When we arrive at the log cabin we will unpack, play some games, unwind and head off to bed.

February 6th

We'll wake up and have breakfast to prepare us for our trip through the wilderness. After breakfast we'll head over and meet with the dogs and get to know the "team." When they're all hooked up we'll head out and experience what the Hiawatha Forest has to offer! In the afternoon we'll go snowshoeing and enjoy the snow. After, we'll relax while sipping on hot tea/coffee/chocolate, cook some dinner, and play some games.

February 7th

We'll spend the morning relaxing, making breakfast, and trying any other activities we missed out on yesterday. We'll start heading back to Ann Arbor around 11:30. If the bridge is closed we will spend some time in St. Ignace at the Super 8 waiting for the bridge to reopen. (Activities could include a pizza part and bowling) On the drive we'll stop as often as necessary given road conditions: Gaylord, Saginaw, etc. When we arrive back at the OAC, we will unpack, cleanup, and head home - refreshed from the weekend and ready for the world!

Expectations Of Participant

- All participants MUST attend the pre-trip meeting. The date, time and location of this meeting varies from trip to trip, and can be found at the OAC website.
- All participants MUST complete the OA medical information, trip waiver, and trip release forms
- Participants are expected to provide, at their own cost, all personal gear, including but not limited to: sleeping bags, backpacks, eating utensils, shoes, boots, mountain bike, and clothing suggested at the pre-trip meeting (waterproof layers, etc).
- All participants must adhere to Outdoor Adventures policies and procedures.

Trip Does NOT Include

(Note: Other costs may arise for which the participant will be solely responsible).

- Travel to/from parts B and C of trip information section
- Shots, immunizations, or other medical costs
- Taxes, entry fees, or other costs associated with entering or leaving a country
- Passport application or other document fees
- Personal rental items during the program (photos, videos, backpacks, climbing gear, mountain bike, wet suits, etc).
- Meals outside those specified in part E of trip price includes section
- Rentals - Participants are responsible for providing trip specific items such as a trail ready backpack, sleeping bag and pad tat are subject to a leader's inspection. All associated costs are participant's responsibility.
